ECHO helps find housing for the homeless by Paula Wibberley, Services Coordinator

ECHO received the Rapid Re-Housing Grant this year which has given us the privilege of assisting fifteen individuals/ couples with no minor children to move into housing and off of the streets. When the pre-screening began for this grant, a multitude of people applied, yet we could only help the first 15. As I talked through the application with each client to see if they qualified, I learned their story, their difficulties and the cause of their crisis. There was a great sense of urgency, as many were literally sleeping on the streets

On the third day, about 3:00 p.m. a young man, BJ, sat in my office. I began to explain to him what Rapid Re-housing

would do for him, if he qualified and that we would only be able to help 15 people. As I told him this I reached for the next folder filled with paperwork. As I picked up that folder I realized it was the last... the 15th. I smiled and told him, "And you are the 15th."

Upon hearing he had just barely made the "cut" BJ's hands covered his eyes and he began to weep. It was a moment I will never forget! For a second the tears seemed mixed – pain and relief, but seconds later this young man lifted his hands in praise and for several minutes thanked God for His faithfulness, love and goodness. Needless to say, I too was crying and praising the Lord with him.



When the rejoicing calmed down, BJ told me about his struggles. He is a father. He has a son that he loves very much and he wants his son to know and understand there are consequences to our actions and we need to be responsible for them. He told me that he sees his son as often as he can and he wants him to know that God is faithful.

BJ believes that God will use his experiences for His glory – to help others.

And I'm happy to say he did qualify, and he moved into his apartment this week!

I am so thankful for the opportunity to be a part of ECHO and stories like BJ's.


A New Chapter for ECHO
